Risk Assessment

A Risk Assessment should be completed for all new employees and researchers by their immediate line or laboratory manager. It should be signed by your Principle Investigator (PI). You should keep a copy of this for your own records and the local Safety Officer should also have a copy.

UCL Safety Services, mandatory course for all new staff and post graduates

"Principles of Laboratory Safety" is an e-learning course available via <u>Moodle</u>. The course is a mandatory training requirement for all new post-graduate research students starting work in laboratories and we recommend the course is completed by all new laboratory staff.

The course, which takes about 30 minutes to complete aims to inform participants about good laboratory practices and instil safe behaviours which apply to all laboratory environments. The material covers six key areas presented in short presentations, with a quiz at the end. The modules are:

- 1. Understanding your responsibilities
- 2. Understanding hazards
- 3. Risk assessments and procedures
- 4. Controlling risks
- 5. Managing waste safely
- 6. Knowing how to respond in an emergency

As with all e-based courses you will need your 'ucbt' number and password to sign in, so please make sure you enrol to be correctly registered. If you have any problems with access or any feedback, please let us know by e-mailing safety@ucl.ac.uk

N.B. If you are employed at another college / institution, are a part time visitor to UCL or an undergraduate you do not need to take this course.

Fire Safety

Building Access

Your UCL ID card is also an access card. This card can be programmed for a number of Divisional facilities by UCL Access Systems on request by your Operations/Health & Safety Team members.
